
If you wish to participate and have children in church school, an extended class for your children will be available for the last ten minutes.

The **Per Capita** Apportionment for the calendar year 2010 is \$34.92 per <u>active</u> member. The Per Capita is an assessment made to each church for those on the active members roll (including youth members) as of December 31 of a preceding year. The funds go toward paying the administrative costs of The General Assembly, Synod, and Presbytery. We encourage each member to do what they can to contribute their share, as the church as a whole is responsible for the total amount (approximately \$8,070).

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...



Dear Friends,

I am writing this article on the eve of what would have been my mother's 88th birthday (September 22nd) and so my heart and mind are deep in remembrance of her. One of the many things I remember most of my mother was her deep and abiding faith. She taught us by word and by action how to live a life that reflected Christ's love to all whom she met. We almost never missed a Sunday at church. She taught Sunday school and played the piano for the choir as they practiced their anthem before worship. My mother showed by example how important being part of a worshiping community was. I think I learned that lesson pretty well for I cannot imagine living my life apart from a community of faith.

Unfortunately we live in a time when participation in the life of a church is not "in vogue". Many churches have seen a drop in attendance and membership over the last decade or so. With the economic crisis churches have also seen a drop in giving - some to the point that they are now faced with closing their doors.

Here at Hope we are excited about the things we have planned for this year. However we need your presence in order to make our activities successful. In this newsletter are announcements about upcoming events and I hope you will read it with your calendar in hand so that you can mark down all the dates.

I found a short story that made me think and so I share it with you.

There is a story told about the famous actor Charles Laughton. One night he attended a dinner party. After dinner they gathered in the living room. The host called upon him to recite the 23rd Psalm. He said he would. His timing and intonation were perfect. And we Americans seem to love anything said with a British accent. He recited the 23rd Psalm that night. Then they went around the room and others were invited to offer something. There was an old woman sitting in the corner. She happened to be the aunt of the host. She was asked if she would recite something.

She was nearly deaf so she hadn't heard what had gone before. She stood up and started to recite the 23rd Psalm. People at first were embarrassed. It was an awkward situation to have her recite the same psalm as the great actor Charles Laughton. Before she finished, people were caught up in her recitation. Some began to weep. It was a tour de force.

Later somebody asked Mr. Laughton why her reading was so moving when she didn't have any of the skills that he had as an actor. He said, "I know the psalm. She knows the shepherd."

As we travel through this fall season, let us ask ourselves, "Do we know the shepherd?" I look forward to seeing you on Sunday!

Every two years we hold a confirmation/commission class for our 8th and 9th graders. At the end of the class each student is given the option of being confirmed if they feel ready. One of the main assignments is for the students to write a statement of faith. This statement is then read out loud at for the entire Session. KNOW YOUR ELDER-CATHIE STRAUSS

Greetings!

I like to think that I've learned something in my life, like how to treat others fairly, how to love abundantly, how to cook a turkey, and how to smile, even when I don't feel like it. Our Lord, Jesus Christ, commissioned us to do unto others as we would like them to do unto us. I like to feel that I'm a generous person, can listen to reason and make judgments according to the sense of things.

My upbringing in the church had been one of a conservative nature brought forth from my parents who thought, "children are to be seen, and not heard" and "good better best, never let it rest, till the good is better and the better best". Our family was a church going family involved in most aspects of being a "good" member.

I wandered away from the church as an adult. I was born in Denver, Colorado. I met my husband, Allan, a NJ native, while he was stationed there in the service. Our son, Joseph was born in Denver. A long journey from the Colorado mountains to the New Jersey shores brought me to rest at Hope Presbyterian Church in 1973. I had no immediate family near, and knowing the importance of a Christian education led me to this place. I came to sing in choir, held presidency of United Presbyterian Women, and even taught Sunday school, worked on the worship and fellowship committees. My daughter Aimee was born after we became "family" here at Hope. She came along and attended every meeting, luncheon, every pot luck dinner and she too was raised in this church. Now, after 43 happily married years, my children have children who were baptized here and my granddaughters have been confirmed here at Hope.

Currently, I serve on session as your Membership chairperson. Bob Blake and I co-chair each other's committee. There is connection to Stewardship and Membership that encourages us to take our faith seriously and to share talents. Producing the church newsletter with our secretary, Veralynn, is one of most joyous assignments. I love hearing from each and every one of you and sharing the love of Christ. Together we are the church. Each and every week, I attend church bringing my burdens to the Lord. I hear and am supported by the Word of God and by the unfailing support from my "Family" here at Hope. I hold it a measure of success in my life. I wish and pray for all of you to have the Peace.

Statement of Faith

I believe God is our strength and helps us through our struggles and suffering to find who we are and how strong we truly are. He gives us something to believe in and someone to look forward to. God shows you a path and guides you as best HE can with the decisions you make. God is our spirit and God is good. God is more than we can know or think. He is living, not just an idea, but a person who loves, rejoices, and regrets. God can be angry, compassionate, jealous and merciful. God is love, just, and unchangeable. And God is faithful and dependable.

Jesus shows us who God is and who we really are. Jesus taught people about God's kingdom or rule of love and righteousness. Some of his teachings are found in the Sermon of the Mount. In Matthew 5:3-11, there are nine verses called the Beatitudes. Each begins with the word "blessed". These verses tell who are the truly happy people, the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meak, those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, the merciful, the pure in heart, and the peace makers. Jesus also said that we should love our enemies and that we should not worry about living, eating or drinking, because God knows our needs. Jesus shows us who God is, and in showing this, Jesus helps us find who we really are.

The Holy Spirit in my opinion is the power and will of God. To some people the Holy Spirit is, in their own words, "God's Messenger". The Holy Spirit is the moving power of God that has been around since the beginning of God; a companion that has journeyed with many people and will journey with you. The Holy Spirit moves over the waters of creation and humanity. It is the same Spirit that strengthened the chosen people of God. The Spirit that filled Mary so she gave birth to Jesus. The Spirit that was present at Jesus' baptism. The same Spirit that chose Jesus to preach the good news, love, heal, and save. And the Holy Spirit is the same Spirit that dwells with us every day of our lives.

The Bible is not one book, as it may appear, but many books. The Bible is actually sixty-six books. The word "Bible" tells us that this is really a library of smaller books. The word Bible comes from the Greek word *Biblia*, which means "little books" or "booklets". The books of the Bible tell the story of God's covenant with people who claim as our faith ancestors.

The church is like a body. And Like a body, the church has many parts. These different parts have been given a variety of different jobs to build up the body. One of these parts cannot say to another "I don't need you" because all of these parts have different and equally important jobs. If any of these parts fall through, then it effects the proper running and functioning of the church, just as if one of your organs stopped working, your body would not run or function properly.

Many people choose to become church members because of their desire to commit their lives to Jesus Christ and to become an active part of the ongoing life of the Christian community. By uniting the church, one becomes a part of the fellowship of Christian believers. This is a fellowship in which Christ's spirit is present, and through which he continues redeeming the work in the world.

Somewhere in the middle of one of my confirmation classes, I told Barbara that I found it difficult to put my faith in others. She then said to me "Sarah, I really hope you can find someone to put your faith into someday." Well, I can now say that I have found someone to put my faith in. I am able to put my faith in the loving, kind and dependable God. I am able to put my faith in Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, and the whole Presbyterian Church.

Our government does not currently provide money to buy servicemen and women refreshments in this situation.




