How to speak Presbyterian

It has been estimated that 58 percent of the members of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) did not grow up in the denomination. For readers in that category, here is a short rundown of the lingo you are likely to hear in a Presbyterian church that you may not have heard in another church.

Election

No, this doesn't refer to how commissioners are selected to go to the General Assembly. It is a theological term that means God makes the first move in acting to redeem sinners. People within the covenant of faith are called "the elect." Reformed (or Presbyterian) theology teaches that we are incapable of saving ourselves from our sins, and that God "elects" or "chooses" to save us.

Predestination

This word, similar to *election*, often raises questions for people of other denominations. Basically predestination means that our election by God occurred not only before we were born, but so far back in time that it happened "before the creation of the world" (see Ephesians 1:4).

A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR...



Dear Friends,

From time to time folks ask me questions about why we do what we do in worship. The Presbyterian Church has set up guidelines for congregations in the way our worship services ought to be run. These guidelines are written in The Book Of Order which is the book of our church's polity or government. Because we adhere to The Book of Order you could walk into any Presbyterian Church (USA) congregation on any given Sunday and with a few minor exceptions, you would feel very much at home.

One of the most often asked questions is, why do we sing *all* of the verses of a hymn? As most of you know, during the year when we have two services we limit the verses we sing to just two for the 9:30 service but sing all verses at the 11. We do this because of the time constraints on the 9:30 service.

Singing all verses of a hymn is an important part of the worship service as a whole. My job as worship leader is to make sure that every element of worship tells the story of God and of God's Son, Jesus. The Call to Worship, Prayer of Confession, Scriptures, Sermon, Prayer of Dedication, Pastoral Prayer and all the hymns are chosen and written to enhance the theme of the particular Sunday and its message.

Hymn writing was most prolific during the 19th century. Many of the great hymns of the faith came out of that period. When I choose a hymn for us to sing, I look at each word in each verse to see if the story of God's love is found. Sometimes the most important words of the hymn are found in the middle verses. At other times all the verses build until there is a climax in the last verse of the hymn that brings the message together.

For instance, I often hear moans when we begin to sing the Christmas Carol, "We Three Kings" because this hymn has five verses. But if we look closely at those verses we see why. In the first verse we are told that three kings are following a star and are traveling to see where that star takes them. They are taking with them gifts. Each of the next three verses tells us what those gifts were and why they were important. They are important because each of them shows us a different aspect of who Jesus is. Finally the last verse praises God for God's amazing gift of the Christ Child.

Each verse is crucial to the story of that wonderful night. Which verse should we delete? None.

You may not be a great singer; you may not enjoy singing, but we are told to sing praises to God and to worship God with hymns—and so we do. I encourage you to take the time during our hymn singing to read the words of the verses and see if you can find the words that tell us the story of God's love, and then lift your voice in praise to our God who is our Creator, Redeemer and Sustainer.
