November 20th following the pot luck supper and mission trip report, we will meet and discuss <u>Love Wins</u> by Rob Bell. Bell presents a deeply biblical vision for rediscovering a richer, grander, truer and more spiritually satisfying way of understanding heaven, hell, God, Jesus, salvation, and repentance. The result is the discovery that the "good news" is much, much better than we ever imagined!

January 15th following the pot luck supper we will meet and discuss <u>Heaven is for Real</u> by Todd Burpo. "When Colton Burpo made it through an emergency appendectomy, his family was overjoyed at his miraculous survival. What they weren't expecting, though, was the story that emerged in the months that followed-a story as beautiful as it was extraordinary, detailing their little boy's trip to heaven and back. <u>Heaven is for Real</u> will forever change the way you think of eternity, offering the chance to see, and believe, like a child.

March 18th following the pot luck supper we will meet and discuss <u>Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet</u> by Jamie Ford. Ford tells a heartwarming story of fathers and sons, first loves, fate, and the resilient human heart. Set in the ethnic neighborhoods of Seattle during World War II and in Japanese American internment camps, this beautifully written book will make you think. And, more important, it will make you *feel*.


